Resene kids art with Mark Rayner – 42



Create a multi-coloured mirror frame with the help of Resene and a bag of brightly coloured buttons.



You will need:

- Circular mirror in an MDF frame (ours came from 'Spotlight')
- PVA glue
- Resene Multishield+ gloss
- Resene Quick Dry waterborne primer undercoat
- Selection of multi-coloured buttons
- Resene testpot in Resene Turbo



Step one

Carefully remove the mirror from the frame (you might need to get a grownup to help with this bit). Put the mirror to one side, in a safe place.

Step two

Paint the entire MDF frame with one coat of Resene Quick Dry waterborne primer undercoat, allowing one hour to dry.

Step three

Paint the frame with two coats of Resene Turbo, allowing two hours for each coat to dry.



Step four

Apply one coat of Multishield+ gloss to the frame and allow to dry for two hours.

Step five

Stick coloured buttons to the front of the frame using PVA glue and allow to dry overnight.

Step six

Carefully place the mirror back into the frame (again, you might need a grownup to help with this bit too).

Top tip:

Keep the frame flat while the glue dries otherwise the buttons might move.



Here's another idea:

Paint an artists' canvas with a testpot of Resene Keppel and decorate with coloured buttons and sequins to create your own coloured star artwork.
