A vibrant palette of colours make the spaces in these townhouses feel bigger than they are.

Developing two small townhouses on a rear lot in suburban Christchurch would ordinarily lead to small boxes with low ceilings, painted neutral shades inside and out. When building two townhouses – one to live in, one to rent – architects Paul Anselmi and Maria Chen realised white would only make them feel closed in. Cue a vibrant palette of colours that make the spaces feel bigger than they are.

Resene Blumine is a beautiful backdrop to the kitchen, opposite a living area in Resene Zumthor. Resene Grass Hopper, meanwhile, takes you up the stairs under the skylight to bedrooms in Resene Teal Blue and Resene Quarter Periglacial Blue... It is a confident, bold palette that works beautifully.
