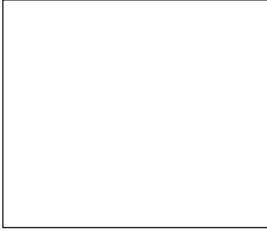
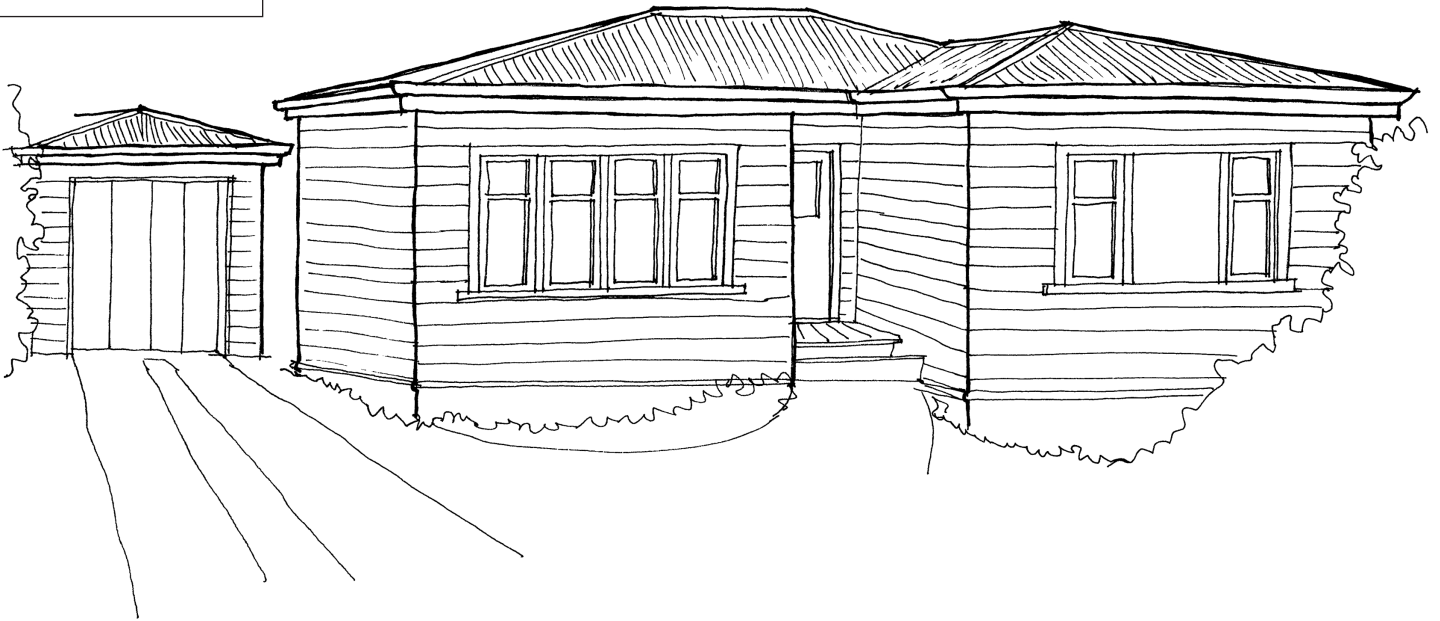


Create your own colour scheme

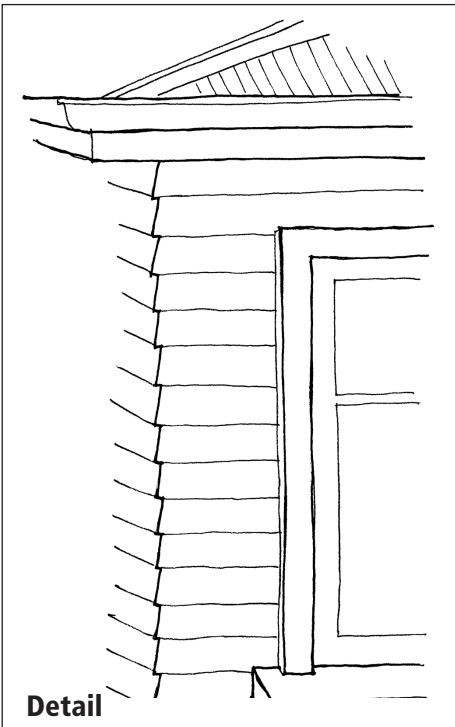


Roof

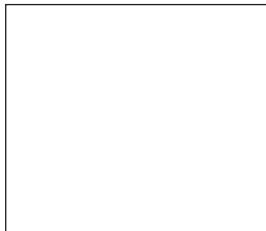
The roof may not be a dominant part of your colour scheme. Choose a colour for durability and to fit with the rest of the colour scheme. Resene Summit Roof (satin) or Resene Hi-Glo (gloss) is ideal. See the Resene Roof systems colour chart for colour ideas. Consider using a Resene CoolColour to minimise heat buildup.

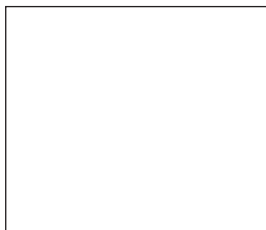
Weatherboards

Weatherboards are the most dominant part of your colour scheme. Choose a light or off-white colour with the base in a darker colour if desired. Use Resene Hi-Glo (gloss), Resene Sonyx 101 (semi-gloss) or Resene Lumbersider (satin).



Windows and doors

Windows may be painted the same colour as the weatherboards. 'Pick out' the opening windows in a contrasting colour. Use Resene Enamacryl (gloss waterborne enamel), Resene Lustacryl (semi-gloss waterborne enamel) or Resene SpaceCote Low Sheen (waterborne enamel).



Trim

Paint fascias, bargeboards and windowsills in lighter or darker colours to add contrast to your colour scheme.

Build your scheme by adding swatches of your favourite Resene colours to the boxes. Or try out Resene EzyPaint virtual painting software and see your favourite Resene colours virtually painted onto your own project.
