You will need:

- 1.5m of 25mm x 10mm dressed timber
- Clean cloth
- Paintbrushes (including an artists' brush)
- Pencil
- Resene Quick Dry
- Resene testpots of Resene Designer White and Resene Gunmetal
- Ruler
- Sandpaper
- Saw



Step one

Measure and mark a 50mm section of wood using the pencil and ruler, as shown. Cut with the saw.



Step two

Repeat step 1 until you have 28 pieces of wood.



Step three

Smooth the sawn edges with sandpaper and wipe off any sanding residue with a clean cloth.



Step four

Apply one coat of Resene Quick Dry to the wooden pieces and allow two hours to dry.



Step five

Apply one coat of Resene Designer White to the wooden pieces and allow two hours to dry.



Step six

Apply a second coat of Resene Designer White to the wooden pieces and allow two hours to dry.



Step seven

Begin to mark dots on each piece using the artists' brush and Resene Gunmetal.



Step eight

Continue until you have all pieces marked from 'double blank' to 'double six', as shown. Allow paint to dry.





To get the look:

Protect the natural beauty of wooden flooring with Resene Qristal ClearFloor.



Other ideas:

Create traditional dominoes by painting each piece with Resene Black and the dots with Resene Alabaster.
