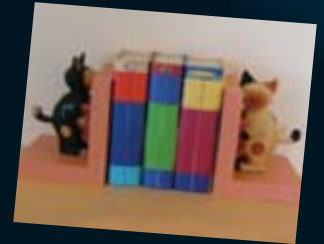


### You will need:

- Four squares of wood measuring 10cm x 10cm
- One testpot of Resene Japonica
- Paintbrush
- PVA Glue
- Resene Quick Dry Acrylic Primer Undercoat
- Two wooden cats



Create these fun bookends using a few squares of timber, some wooden animals and a Resene testpot.



### Top tip:

Wooden animals can be found at ethnic craft shops and markets.



### Here's another idea:

Paint a couple of action figures with Resene Time Warp and glue each one to a wooden base to create a couple of cool CD-ends.

### Step one

Using the PVA, glue one piece of wood to the other to form a right angle. Do the same with the other two pieces of wood and allow to dry.



### Step two

Prime these with one coat of Resene Quick Dry Acrylic Primer Undercoat and allow to dry.



### Step three

Paint these with two coats of Resene Japonica and allow to dry.



### Step four

Glue the wooden cats onto the bookends with PVA glue. Allow to dry before using.
