

all on board

Spruce up your garage this season with a fresh lick of paint and a bespoke storage solution designed to suit your family (and their stuff!)

If your garage has turned into a dumping ground, this pegboard idea could be just what you need to reclaim order. Designs can be as individual as your family, and the addition of a blackboard brings creative flair to the tidying-up process.

you will need

- White pegboard (available at leading hardware stores)
- Assorted pegboard hooks
- Long screws
- Washers or spacers
- A screwdriver
- A tape measure
- A pencil
- Masking tape
- A roller and sleeves
- Resene Lustacryl semi-gloss waterborne enamel paint in your choice of colours, Resene Blackboard Paint and Resene Walk-on paint (optional).

method

- 1 Paint your wall and floor, if desired. We used Resene Lustacryl in Spindle for the wall and Resene Walk-on in Gunsmoke for the floor.
- 2 Use masking tape to translate your design onto the pegboard. We created a grid of nine coloured squares and a separate rectangular blackboard with a white frame.
- 3 Paint your first coat of each colour using a roller. Allow for drying time then apply a second coat.
- 4 Once the paint is dry, remove the masking tape, revealing clean straight edges in the pegboard's original white.
- 5 Use a pencil to mark your pegboard's position on the wall, aligning screws with wall beams and nogs to enhance support.
- 6 With help, fix board to the wall with long screws and a screwdriver. Use washers or spacers on your screws in order to create a 1-2cm gap between the board and wall.
- 7 Gather your hooks and mount items on the pegboard.
